


State Final Demand and Gross State Product








Share of GSP






Employment Unemployment Rate Participation Rate






ANNUAL CHANGE IN PERSONS EMPLOYED Western Australia, By Industry, February 2016












UNEMPLOYMENT RATE Western Australia, Annual Average Rate



YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (15 to 24 years) Annual Average, Original









Western Australia Wage Price Index

WAGE PRICE INDEX











Perth Consumer Price Index




